As we enter the 7th month of the pandemic, mental health is becoming an increasing concern. Typically, this isn't something that would be a feature in a band newsletter - but I think it's worth it.

Recently, a group of high school seniors got together in the wee hours of the morning. They wore masks and they held signs. Those signs read, "Our Mental Health Matters, Too". This is not an attempt to engage in a political conversation but is a blatant attempt to remind you to touch base with your kids, often, and specifically. How are they doing? Don't accept "fine" as a re-

sponse. Are they losing interest in even trying to schedule fun activities? How is their appetite? Has it changed? Have their sleeping patterns changed? Are they tearful, hopeless, allude to feeling helpless?

If I hear that these are "unprecedented times" one more time, I may spit. But it's true... What's also true is that our high school students NEED social interaction. It isn't a bonus and it isn't just something nice for them. It is positively a developmental need....

Yes, COVID seems to be getting worse in Dona Ana County again and I urge you

to follow local laws and regulations; but do not lose sight of the potential cost of severe challenges to mental health. In Farmington, NM, one report indicated that they have experienced in 125% increase in suicide during these, "unprecedented times". This is important; and I will include some resources in this newsletter. Take care of each other. Text, call, chat, etc. And, if it's ok, get together. Lift each other up and ask the hard questions.

The All State Auditions are approaching fast and many CHS Band students are participating. If your student has signed up, Ms. Padilla has officially registered them and the fee(s) are now due.

The fee for All State Band Audition is \$17 per instrument. The fee for All State Jazz Band Audition is \$20 per instrument.

If you don't know if your student signed up for an audition, please let one of the Directors know or reach out to Jeni or Deb. We all have the list of students who have been registered and therefore owe money on their band account now.

You can make a payment by logging into your account on Charms. Go to CharmsOffice.com. In the top right corner, click "Login" then "Parents/

Students/Helpers". The school code is CHSBandLasCruces. Your initial password is your student's LCPS ID number. You will immediately be prompted to set up your own password. Once you've been able to login, click the "Finances" button. Scroll down to "Make a Miscellaneous Payment". Complete the payment process. In the note include "2020 Allstate Fee).

That's it! Then, you will also have your Charms account set up and you are able to modify demographic information and monitor the account at your convenience. If you have any trouble with Charms, please let Jeni or Deb know. Contact information is on the last page of every newsletter.
